



Frequently Asked Questions 2027-2028 Grant Cycle

What is the funding cycle for a traditional grant?

July 1-June 30

How do I apply for an NCF grant?

Applications open June 1, 2026, and are due August 21, 2026. The link for the 2027-2028 Grant Application can be found on the **Get Involved** page of the NCF website:

How do I know if my organization is eligible for an NCF grant?

The [Grant Guidelines](#) (found on the Get Involved Page of the NCF website) explain our eligibility requirements.

When will I be notified if my application was accepted for funding?

Award notifications are made in mid-February, following the annual Naples Winter Wine Festival. Notifications are sent via the online grants management system.

How much should I apply for?

NCF's philosophy is to invest in a smaller number of organizations in order to make a greater impact. Funding typically does not exceed:

- 50% of a program's operational budget or
- 25% of an organization's annual operating budget

Does NCF fund start-ups?

No. NCF looks to invest in organizations with a proven track record of successful outcomes. An organization must be in operation, serving children in Collier County, for at least one year prior to applying.

I just applied to the IRS to become a 501(c)3, can I apply for funding?

You must be officially awarded 501 (c) 3 status by the time your application is submitted.

What are the reporting requirements if we are awarded a grant from NCF?

All grantees are required to submit quarterly impact reports. The report questions primarily focus on outcomes and quarterly expenditures and are submitted via an online grants management system.

If our service area is outside of Collier County, can we apply?

NCF only awards grants to organizations that serve children in Collier County. If your organization serves children in Collier County, and beyond, NCF funds are restricted to serving Collier County children only.

Can I apply as an individual/family for direct grant support of my child?

No. NCF funding is only awarded to registered 501 (c) 3 organizations that serve at-risk and underprivileged children.

Will I have an opportunity to present my request to the Grant Committee?

Unfortunately, with the large amount of grant applications that NCF receives each year, there is not enough time to allow for presentations of your request. If clarifying questions are needed, a staff member from the Grants Department. will reach out to the grant contact.

Can I apply to be an NCF Strategic Initiative Partner?

No. Only current NCF beneficiaries are eligible to be invited as Strategic Initiative Partners. This process is led by the Grants Department—not initiated by the beneficiary. Strategic Initiative Partners, also referred to as Blueprint Partners, are established beneficiaries who have undergone a thorough vetting process. The Grant Committee determines whether an organization aligns with a Strategic Initiative and makes all decisions regarding inclusion.
